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- **During this 4-week May Term course offering through the Audubon Center of the North Woods and Northland College, students will gain experience teaching outdoor education topics at the Audubon Center of the North Woods' residential campus in east-central Minnesota**
- **Work with the Audubon Center's professional education staff first observing classes, then team teaching with Audubon Center staff and Northland peers, and ultimately solo teaching**
- **Gain valuable insights and experiences into teaching techniques during your course while working with students from all over Minnesota, ranging in ages from kindergarten – 12th grade**
- **Course offerings include orienteering, outdoor survival, stream ecology, Minnesota mammals, rock climbing wall, high ropes course, low ropes course, canoeing, ojibwe crafts and culture, team initiatives, and many more**
- **Camp on-site at the Audubon Center's campground and have all meals provided through their food service at the Dining Hall**



OUTCOMES: Through this course students will:

Students gain experience teaching in an outdoor education facility with diverse school groups over a 4 week period
Students enhance their teaching ability through experience, self, peer and school evaluations
Students become familiar with several classes including adventure, cultural, science, wildlife, and team-building
